Hooge	22/4/16		Day quiet. One man killed and right Company frontage sniped. Disposition: 2 Co'ys front, 1 Halfway House, Platoon R.S.S, 1 Co'y Zillebeke Bund. All available men used on Working Parties every night, mostly front line and G.T's.	Wet, rain
"	23/4/16		Heavy shelling, especially on right Company frontage at Hooge cellars 5.1 H.E. and T.M. Bombs from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and again from 5 to 6 p.m. resulting in three killed and 14 wounded, mostly "B" Co. Gordon House and vicinity of Headquarters (Bn). and Doray House Lane about 100 H.E. No damage.	Bright mild
"	24/4/16		Enemy started shelling about 6 a.m. on support trenches and Yeomanry Post and Gordon House, where Artillery Observation Posts are located at 7 p.m. apparently mine blown, vicinity St. Eloi and enemy put on a heavy barrage west of Zillebeke Dugouts and in depth to Shrapnel Corner and latterly to Menin Road, at Hellfire Corner. Extra precautions being taken against Gas Attack, as deserter reports gas installed on Ypres salient front. Considerable shelling by enemy on our left Company frontage and C.T. Ten casualties from Shrapnel.	Bright mild
"	25/4/16		Comparatively quiet, usual amount of shelling on points in rear. No material damage on Bn. frontage. Worked Bn. hard on repairing damage done the day before. Casualties 2 wounded & shock.	Fine warm
"	26/4/16		"B" Co'y on right in Hooge cellars heavily shelled about 4.30 p.m. for two hours with H.E. and T.M. Bombs, loosing 4 killed and 8 wounded. Men behaved splendidly. Front trenches and Grafton Street badly damaged. Heavy fighting vicinity of St. Eloi.	Fine warm
"	27/4/16		Enemy artillery active all day, mostly back of support trenches, 2 wounded.	Fine, warm
"	28/4/16		Quiet. Relieved by 52nd Can. Battalion. Relief completed 2.35 a.m. Nothing unusual. Wind south west. Two wounded.	Fine, warm
Camp D Sheet 28	29/4/16		Quiet all day. Heavy artillery fire started at 12.45 A.M., apparently threatened Mount Kemmel Gas alarm 1.05 A.M. and Battalion stood to, ready to move on half an hours notice. Stood down 4.15 A.M. N.E.E.	Fine warm
H 14 A 9.6	30/4/16		Quiet all day, some shelling of Vlamertinghe. 260 men sent up nightly on working parties to front and support lines. Gas alarm at 11 P.M. Bn. again stood to until 2 A.M. with helmets rolled. Attack was at Hullrich. Enemy made no progress.	Fine, warm
