"	"	20	Quiet day on the whole with the exception of German shelling of our batteries in the immediate vicinity. Battalion relieved the 52nd Canadian Battalion in the front line trenches at Hill 60, one company of the 58th Canadian Battalion moving into BATTERSEA FARM, and coming under the orders of the C.O. 60th Canadian Battalion. Relief completed 12.30 a.m. Night quiet.	appendix V
Hill 60	"	21	Shelling very light. Every available man working on trenches under C.E. supervision.	" "
"	"	22	Intermittent shelling during the day, principally with 5.9s on CUTTING and light trench mortars, also rifle grenades. We retaliated, sending over about 5 for 1.	" "
"	"	23	Considerable hostile shelling during the day with trench mortars, heavy and light. We retaliated effectively, causing enemy to cease fire.	Cloudy, Rain
"	"	24	Light shelling. C.O. and officers of the 1st Royal Warwickshire Regiment visited the line and made arrangements for relief. Relieved by 1st Royal Warwickshire Regt. and moved by MARCH ROUTE to Ypres, thence by train to Camp St. Lawrence. Relief completed 1 a.m.	" "
Camp St. Lawrence	"	25	Day spent resting and re-equipping. Orders received that the Battalion would move to the Steenevoorde area and that an Australian Division was moving up and would take over CAMP ST. LAWRENCE.
