

Slack, with OpIs. Clark and McDonald, went out along eastern edge of Railway track, running into AVION, as far as the BOIS DE LA CHAUDIERE, where they came under rifle and machine gun fire from direction of AVION. Shortly after they got to the wood, the 43rd Canadian Battalion came along, and dug in, in squares T.7, 8, and 15. This patrol reported that there was a large quantity of artillery ammunition in dugouts along the railway embankment. The enemy shelled our position along the Railway heavily, all day on the 14th. We were relieved by two platoons of 53th Battalion about ~~2~~ 2 a.m. on night of 14th/15th., and moved back in PYLONES TRENCH.

On afternoon of April 16th., we were relieved by a G Company of the R.C.Rs., and moved back to VILLERS-AU-BOIS.
