Camp "D"	12/6/16.		Battalions on one hour's notice. At 6:30 p.m. moved to SCOTTISH LINES, G. 23. 29. 9. Still one one hour's notice. During the night, heavy bombardment by our Artillery on our old front line trenches in front and to the right of SANCTUARY WOOD, followed by attack by 15th, 16th and 58th Bns. and considerable of our old front line trenches on Hill 62 retaken, and approximately 191 prisoners captured <u>(portion)</u>	Wet, Cool. <i>MS</i>
	13/6/16.		A certain amount of training and re-organization done during the day. At 5:00 P.M. received orders to relieve the 52nd Bn. at ZILLEBEKE SWITCH AND ZILLEBEKE BUND, two Companies coming under orders of 56th Bn. Moved off by companies 8:00 pm, relief completed at 1:30 am, without incident. Subsequently during the night the legs were moved up to the front line relieving the legs of the 52nd Bn.	Wet, cool. <i>MS</i>
	14/6/16.		Heavy shelling all day on front line and BUND. Very few casualties. At 5:00 p.m. received orders to relieve 52nd Bn. in front-line, one company 43rd Battalion coming under orders of 56th Canadian Battalion and occupying MAPLE STREET. Relief completed at 1:00 am, without incident. Reconnaissance was made of old front-line trenches and advanced Bombing Post established. No enemy was encountered and trenches found in very bad condition.	Cool. <i>MS</i>
	15/6/16.		Heavy shelling front-line trenches during day, very few casualties. Relieved during night of 15th/16th by 1st Battalion - Scots Guards - and moved by Platoons by IPRES-POPERINCHE ROAD to Camp "A", G. 11. C. 3. 3. Relief completed 1.45 am, without incident.	Quiet, Cool. <i>MS</i>
	16/6/16.		Allowed men to rest during day. All ranks pretty well done up, having been almost continually in the front-line trenches, or close support, for a period of 32 days.	Quiet, Light rain. <i>MS</i>
	17/6/16.		Re-Organization and instructions	Fine. <i>MS</i>
	18/6/16.		Church parade morning. 9 new Officers and 325 other ranks drafted to the Battalion.	Fine, calm. <i>MS</i>
	19/6/16.		A further draft of eight officers from SHORNCLIFFE taken on the strength.	Cloudy, Cool. <i>MS</i>
