Operation Order No. 17,
By Lieut. Col. F. A. Gascougne,
O. C. 60th Canadian Battalion,
Victoria Rifles of Canada,
In the Field,

April 1st, 1916.

1. The 60th Can. Battalion, V.R.C., will be relieved to-night by the 52nd Can. Battalion.
2. When relief is completed, Platoon Commanders will report "Relief completed" to their Company Commanders and move off independently to Camp "E" moving via Observatory Hill Road, Cross Roads, I 20 A 5.4 Lille Gate, Kruisstraat, to H 22 A 10.10 to H 21 B 8.8 to H 14 B 3.8 to Camp "E" H 19 B 6.7.
3. O's. C. Co's will report to Battalion Headquarters immediately the relief of their Unit is completed.
4. Trench stores will be handed over and receipts made out in triplicate, one to be given to the outgoing Unit, one to be sent to Bde. Headquarters, the third to be retained by the incoming Unit.
5. All stores and personal effects to be carried on Transport must be at ration dump not later than 6 p.m.
6. Guides will report to Headquarters of 52nd Battalion at Transport Farm I 21 A Central at 6 p.m. sharp.
7. RATIONS. The ration distribution will be the same for to-morrow as for to-day with the exception of changes caused by men who may be taken on or struck off the Battalion Ration Strength.
8. Reports will be sent to Battalion Headquarters, Maple Copse, until relief is completed, afterwards to Camp "E" at H 19 B 6.7.
