1. In accordance with Brigade Orders, the 60th Canadian Battalion will be relieved by the 52nd Canadian Battalion in the HOOGE Trenches on the night of April 28/29 and will go into Brigade Reserve In CAMP "C" at G 18 a 3.8.
2. Route - road and railroad track to Asylum, thence train to BRANDHOEK, road to Camp.
3. "A" Company will furnish nine guides and "B" Company fourteen guides, all under Capt. Redmond, who will meet the incoming Battalion at Railroad crossing at I 7 c 3.6, at 8.30 p.m. sharp.
4. "C" Company will furnish two N.C.O's, one of whom will guide pumping party on arrival at Culvert, one who will guide three detached post parties to positions in left frontage after their arrival at Culvert.
5. O. C. Companies will report to Battalion Headquarters when relief of their Company is completed using word "RADWAY".
6. "Primus" stoves and Very Pistols will be handed over to incoming unit and receipts taken.
7. Companies in front line will wear rubber boots going out, with exception of platoons in R. Line, who will carry boots down and leave at Bn. Headquarters (Halfway House).
8. Sufficient guides will be detailed from Lewis Gun crews to meet Transport of incoming unit at Ration Dump at 8.30 p.m. and take incoming sections to their posts.
9. Bombing Officer will arrange to have guides at Battalion H. Qrs at 9.00 p.m. to take Bombing Sections to their posts.
10. Reports until relief completed to HALFWAY HOUSE. ~~LATER~~ to Camp "C".
