In the Field,
May 23rd, 1916.

1. 52nd Advance Party.
Referring to Operation Order No. 26 of date. One Officer and one N.C.O. from each company of the 52nd Battalion will report to Officers Commanding Companies by 2.00 P.M. 23rd inst.
2. Trench Wardens.
Traffic and trench control posts and trench wardens will be posted and relieve the 52nd Battalion not later than 6.00 P.M. May 23rd.
3. Trench Stores.
All trench stores will be handed over and receipt obtained, as usual.
4. Working Parties.
No working parties to be furnished by the battalion night of May 23rd-24th.
5. Rations.
Each company and unit will detail a party to receive rations from Transport:-
"A" and "B" Companies at Tramway Terminus, Zillebeke Road.
Other units Transport Farm.
6. 60th Advance Party.
One Officer and one N.C.O. from each company will form an advance party and report to the Adjutant, 52nd Canadian Battalion., and make the necessary arrangements to distribute their companies as provided in Operation Order.
7. Water- Cans.
Every possible water-can and rum jar will be brought out and turned over to the Transport.
8. Movement. To prevent unnecessary casualties, no relief movement will take place before 8.00 P.M., with the exception of the Advance Party, Lewis-Machine-Gun Section, Signal Reliefs and Scouts. Units thus exempted will move in parties not exceeding three and with not less than one hundred yards distance between each group.
