In the Field,
May 29th, 1916.

1. In accordance with instructions from 9th Canadian Infantry Brigade, the Battalion will move night of May 30th-31st to new quarters as shown below and will be in support to front line Battalions:-

"H.Q." to Maple Copse.
"A" to S.P., 13, 14, 16 and 17.
"C" to Maple Copse.
"D" Zillebeke Bund.

No movement to take place before 8.30 P.M.
All stores not required should be sent back to Q.M. Stores night of May 30th-31st.

O. C. "D" Company will keep two runners at Brigade Signal Station, Zillebeke Bund.

2. Route - for "C" Company.

Via the Promenade and Zillebeke Street to Maple Copse.

3. Reports.

Reports of relief to be sent in to H.Q. - Maple Copse.

4. Cleaning.

All dugouts and quarters generally must be left clean.

5. Rations-

"D" Company - Transport Farm - Other details, Ration Night, May 30th.
Dump, Maple Copse, as formerly.
