In the Field,
May 30-16.

Ref. Map Sheet 28. 1/40,000.

1. In accordance with instructions received from 9th Canadian Infantry Brigade, the 60th Canadian Battalion (V.R.C.) will be relieved in Support by the 5th C. M. R. and on completion of relief will move into Divisional Reserve and occupy Camp "A".
2. Lewis-Guns and the Battalion Bombing Platoon will be relieved with the Battalion.
3. On completion of relief, Companies and Bombers will proceed to Camp "A" by routes to be decided upon by O. C. Companies and detachments with the exception that road from Observatory Ridge and to Transport Farm and new trench or path on North Side of Zillebeke Lake must not be used.
4. (a) O. E. Units in Maple Copse will arrange to have all baggage to be carried in Transport, at ration dump not later than 9.00 p.m. Baggage to be taken from Transport Farm must be at dump at 8.45 p.m.

(b) Great care must be taken to see that all water and oil cans are collected at dumps ready for loading.

(c) C. Q. M. S's. will arrange to have kitchens lighted and at least hot tea ready for men on arrival at Camp.
5. Completion of relief will be notified to Battalion Headquarters, Maple Copse, by use of code sentence "Sufficient ammunition".
6. Reports to Maple Copse till completion of relief; after to Camp "A".
