1. In accordance with instructions received from the 9th Infantry Brigade the 60th Battalion will move from its present billets and march to billets in Camp "A" in the new Div. Area. via R 19 B 1.9. FONTAINES road junction R 20 B 3.9 BERTHAN road junction R 16 C 4.6 ME KOKERBELE, WESTOUTRE, HEKSKEN, RENINGHELST, ZEVECOTEN road junction G 30 C 1.7.
2. Assembling point for Battalion less "C" Co'y field N.N.W. Cross Roads at Q 30 C 2 1/2.5.
3. Time. 5.50 a.m. 23/3/16.
4. "C" Co'y will leave billets in time to join the Battalion at Cross Roads at Q 30 B 4.6 at 6 a.m. 23/3/16.
5. DRESS. Marching order. Greatcoats and mess tins will be carried in pack.
6. (a) Billeting party consisting of Lt. F.W. Higgins in charge of two N.C.O's from each Company and two representing Headquarters Company will report to the Staff Captain, 9th Can. Infantry Brigade at 10 a.m. 22nd inst at Cross Roads R 19 A 5.2 and march as a formed body to the new area.
(b) The above billeting party will meet the Battalion on the 23rd instant at Road Junction - G 30 C 1.7.
7. (a) Scout and Machine Gun Sections will report to Battalion Headquarters by 2 p.m. 22nd inst.
(b) The personnel now undergoing instruction in Trench Mortar Work at the Div. Grenade School will rejoin the Brigade on the 21st inst and be attached to Brigade Headquarters from that date until further orders.
8. (a) RATIONS. Company arrangements will be made to give the men a hot meal on the morning of the 23rd inst before leaving billets, but kitchens must be cleaned and ready to move off with Companies to point of assembly.

Note to Para 6:

Billeting party in addition to personnel mentioned in para 6 will include one Scout and 5 cyclists. Entire party will report to the Battalion Orderly Room at 9 a.m. 22nd inst.
