8. (b) All ranks will carry a small haversack ration.
(c) All food remaining unissued by G.O.M.S. will be carried on kitchens.
9. (a) Billets must be left scrupulously clean and O.C. Co'ys will each detail an officer who will make a thorough inspection, and a certificate will be handed to the C.O. that this was done and that the billets were left clean and in good order, by 6 p.m. 23rd inst.
(b) No equipment, ammunition, rations or other material will be left behind.
10. Blankets will be collected from billets at 2.30 p.m. 22nd inst and must be ready rolled in bundles of ten outside billets at this hour.
11. Officers baggage will be ready for collection outside their billets at 5 a.m. 23rd inst sharp.
12. (a) March discipline will be closely watched by Platoon Commanders and O.C. Co'ys will be responsible that their Co'ys are kept well closed up.
(b) When marching at ease rifles will be slung uniformly.
13. Horse standings will be located at H 20 A 1.6. (T.9).
14. Reports will be sent to head of Battalion.
