

April 4th 1917.

- (1) On instructions from the 9th Can. Inf. Bde. the 60th Can. Bn., will be relieved in the VIMY Section, on the night of April 5th., by details of the 8th C.M.Rs. and, on completion of relief, will move to VILLERS-AU-BOIS.
- (2) All baggage and equipment of "B", "C" and "D" Coys. must be on BIRMINGHAM DUMP by 7 p.m. *7:30 p.m.* Baggage of "A" and HQs. Companies on LA PORTIQUE DUMP at 7.30 p.m.
- (3) Water tins belonging to the Battalion, will be taken out, and not turned over as trench stores.
- (4) Dugouts and latrines must be left clean and sanitary.
- (5) Companies will move off independently with at least 100 yards interval between platoons.
- (6) Guides will be selected and ready to meet incoming units, if required, one for each platoon.
- (7) Limber for Lewis Guns will be at inter-section of PONT STREET and BETHUNE ROAD for guns of "C" and "D" Companies, and will pick up guns of "B" and "A" Companies at LA TARGEITE.  
Sgt. McConnell, P. will see that the guns are properly taken care of.
- (8) Completion of relief to be reported by use of code message **XX "97/17"**.
