To 60th Canadian Battalion (VRC) - BEF Operation Order No. 98.

1. The Battalion will parade on Sunday, April 8th, for movement to their position in Assembly Trenches West of Bethune Road, at an hour to be named later.
2. Order of March --- "HQ" "D" "C" "B" "A"

6. "B" and "C" Company will divide space South of Pont St., "A" and "B" Company the space North of Pont Street, starting just above Artillery G.P.  
If necessary, one platoon of "B" Coy. will move to the South of Pont St., "C" and "B" Coy. moving down to make room for them. As the trench is open, not much shelter, and, ~~in~~ in places, wet, men must work to make it habitable, and provide sufficient cover during the night time. From daylight onwards, it is of the utmost importance that absolutely no movement of any kind be made in the trench, otherwise it will draw shellfire from the German Line as, in a great part, the trench is in full view from La Folie Farm.
7. A supply of picks and shovels will be sent to this trench the night before we move in and will be distributed equally between the companies, approximately, 45 shovels and 14 picks per Company. There must be taken forward with the Battalion when they move, for the purpose of consolidation and digging in.
8. Each company will detail an N.C.O. and one man to accompany the limber tonight and guard tools and Lewis Guns Magazines.
9. Twenty-four (24) magazines for each Lewis-Gun will be sent up the night before we go in, by limber, the guns themselves being carried up the trench the following night.
