## **457870 Jeremiah Conroy**

He enlisted in the 60th Battalion on June 12, 1915. He served as a bomber in #3 Platoon of A Company. Conroy was reported missing after the actions at Mount Sorel on June 3, 1916. He was officially confirmed as a Prisoner of War at Dulmen, Germany on July 21, 1916, he spent the next two and a half years in captivity. Jeremiah Conroy has the distinction of being a prisoner of war longer than any other member of the 60th Battalion. He spent a total of nine hundred and seven days in captivity. He was released from captivity December 8, 1918. and Struck off Strength of the battalion May 24, 1919. Jeremiah died December 3, 1955 at the Queen Mary veterans Hospital and is buried in Mount Royal Cemetery, Montreal.
