## **770085 William Arthur Jardine**

Jardine originally enlisted with the 124th Battalion and joined the 60<sup>th</sup> as part of a reinforcing draft on December 6, 1916. He was part of the same wiring party as William Donnachie. He suffered a shrapnel wound to the back and was captured by a German patrol after losing his way in the dark on January 12, 1917. He was released from captivity December 26, 1918 and Struck off Strength of the battalion March 21, 1919. Jardine died August 27, 1980 in Toronto at the West Park Hospital and is buried in Park Lawn cemetery.
