	18th/19th.		<p>18th/19th October. On the night of the 18th we were relieved by the 43rd Canadian Battalion, turning over to them the new line. Before relief on the night of the 18th/19th, all the wounded, of whom there was a very large number when we took over, were evacuated and the trenches pretty well cleaned up. On relief, Companies proceeded to Chalk Pits.</p>		Raining
	22. 9/16.		<p>On the afternoon of 22nd October, three prisoners were taken by the post in High Trench. During the evening High Trench was patrolled for about four hundred yards and post advanced some two hundred yards out High Trench from our line. Bombing Post was advanced to approximately R. 28.03.9 and Bombing Post was also put out in a Westerly direction a short distance from approximately R. 28.03.6.</p>		Fine Light.
	23. 9/16.		<p>An Officer was sent over to report to the Manchester Regiment the establishment of the post in High Trench. The line was turned over on the night of the 22nd/23rd to the 7th Canadian Infantry Battalion and we proceeded to Albert Brickfields. The enemy bombarded the line heavily during relief but fortunately our casualties were very light.</p>		Fine.
