The men worked well first night, with the result we put in one traverse and started another and we also deepened the trench to about 5' 6". On this account on 9-10-16, although we were lightly shelled in the morning and heavily in afternoon, we did not have a casualty. We were relieved at about 9.00 p.m. 9-10-16. I sent the Company out under Lieutenant Thompson, as I had to stay with the Officer Commanding "A" Company, 2nd C.M.R. Bn. About five minutes after ~~that~~ the relief was completed, the Germans put a barrage over us so that I was out off and didn't get out till about 10.15 p.m. On the way out, I reported to Major Chandler and our own Battalion Headquarters and then proceeded to TARA HILL where I found the Company all settled away.
