Operation Order No. 71,
By Major J.V.P.O. Donahoe,
Commanding 60th Canadian Bn. - VRC.
November 11th 1916.

Ref. ROCKLINCOURT, 1/10000

- (1) In accordance with orders from the 9th Can. Inf. Bde., (O.O. 57), the 60th Canadian Battalion will relieve the 52nd Canadian Battalion night of 12/13th of November 1916, on the right Sub-sector.
- (2) Signalling Officer will arrange for relief, leaving billets after the dinner hour.
Lewis Gun crews will relieve earlier than the Battalion leaving billets after dinner hour.
- (3) Companies will leave at 5 minutes intervals, the first Company marching off at 5.15 p.m. and proceed via BRUNHAUT FARM, the Road, AUX HERTZ, MAISON BLANCHE and SAPPER TRENCH, platoons marching ~~in~~ at 100 yards distance after passing road junction in f.l.s.d. Sheet 51.c.
- (4) Companies will be in the line from the right, "C", "D", "B" with "A" Coy. right support, "E" Coy. 43rd Bn. in left support and "C" Co. 43rd Bn. in reserve.
- (5) RATIONS. Rations, tomorrow night will be carried by "B" Coy. of the 52nd Can. Bn.
- (6) One half of the Pioneer Section will remain out, the remainder going into the trenches with Headquarters.
Each Company will have its section of Battalion Bombers attached to it, for this tour.
- (7) Nuts and Lines will be left absolutely clean. They will be ready for inspection at 4.30 p.m.
- (8) DRESS. Full marching order.
- (9) Relief to be reported by the Code message "M.O.D. 12 received".
