

Operation Order No. 40,
By Lieut. Colonel F. A. Gascoigne,
O. C. 60th Canadian Bn - VRC.

In the Field,
September 7th, 1916.

On instructions from the 9th Can. Inf. Bde., the Battalion will move from STEENVOORDE, Second Army Area, to the Reserve Army Area, September 7th, 1916.

Battalion will parade ready to march from STEENVOORDE to BAVINCHOVE at 1.00 P.M. September 7th, where they will embuss at 17.39 for FORT ROUGE Railway Crossing. From there, Battalion will move by march route to ARQUE where they will entrain at 21.39, September 11th, for AUXILLECHATEAU.

Officers' Baggage and kitchens must be ready by 12.00 noon. Unexpended portion of days' rations for evening meal.

Billets must be left clean and sanitary.

Major Evans will have charge of advance billeting party and will move under separate orders.

Particular attention must be paid to march discipline en route and proper distances between Companies maintained.

Two men will be detailed for each wagon to act as Police and to maintain order and to prevent men leaving the train.

On arrival at AUXILLECHATEAU Battalion will detrain and march to a point to be advised later, stopping en route for breakfast.

The Transport will see that all kitchens are sent for ward to join Companies at stopping point and rations delivered from supply wagons.
