Operation Order No. 47,

By Lieutenant Colonel F. A. Gascoigne,
O.C. 60th Canadian Battalion VRC.In the Field,
Sept. 16th, 1916.

On instructions from the 9th Canadian Infantry Brigade, the Battalion will move forward and take up a position behind the road between FABECK GRABEN Trench, R. 28.d.5-7 to R. 28.b.5-7, FERME DE MOUQUET Map 1/5,000, "A" Company on the Right, "D" Company in the Centre, "B" Company on the Left. At 6.30 pm, the Battalion will advance West, bombing along the ZOLLERN GRABEN and the FABECK GRABEN trenches as far as Road between R. 28.c.3.6. and R. 28.a.3.6, which is our objective. The 52nd will move forward at an hour named, pass through Battalion at our objective and advance against the ZOLLERN REDOUBT Trench. That portion of the ZOLLERN GRABEN East of approximately R. 28.b.8.4 will have been captured and occupied by the 9th Canadian Infantry Brigade by the time we reach our jumping off trench. Our objective must be held and steps taken by "A" and "B" Companies to protect their flanks. "C" Coy. will take up a position in the jumping off trench immediately the other three Companies move forward and be prepared to support them. Major O'Donahoe will take charge of operations.

Reports.

Reports will be sent to Bn. Headquarters in Centre Way at R. 24.d.4.6.

The Battalion will be ready to move from USNAK HILL at 1.30 pm sharp and from CHALK PITS not later than 4.30 P.M.

- Kitchens and packs will be left at the Chalk Pits.
