Operation Order No. 45,50

By Lieut. Col. F. A. Gascoigne,
O.C. 60th Canadian Battalion - VRC.

In the Field, Sept. 22nd, 1916.

1. The 7th Bn. will relieve the 60th Bn. in the trenches tonight.
2. Two guides per platoon from "A" and "B", also one from each Lewis-Gun, will meet the incoming unit at 4.00 pm. today at the Red Cross Flag on Main-Albert-Pozieres Road, where Tramway crosses this road.
3. No. 4 Company 7th will relieve our "B" Coy.
 No. 3 do do do do "A" Coy.
 No. 2 do do do 2x "B" Coy. 43rd.
 No. 1 do do do do "B" Coy.

Guides should be lettered from Right to Left :-

"B" Coy.	"A" "B" "C" "D" E
Guns	"E" "F" "G".
"A" Coy.	"H" "I" "J" "K".
Guns	"L" "M" "N" "O".

4. All Ferme du Moquet and Courcellette Maps to be handed over.
5. "A" and "B" Coys. will leave with incoming unit 1 Officer, 1 N.C.O. per Coy. One man per Bombing Post and one man per Lewis-Gun Post. These will be marched back to Bn. 5.00 P.M. 23rd by senior of 52nd Battalion.
6. Relief to be reported to Headquarters by word "Railway".
7. Rations of rum will be served out to each man at the point where Tramway crosses ALBERT-POZIERES Road.
8. Hot meal will be ready at Camp Ground (Usna Hill probably.)
9. Bandoliers and bombs should be handed over to incoming unit, a dump being made by latter in dry place.
10. Companies will bring out all empty water - tins possible.
