Quiet day. Weather unsettled. The Commanding Officer went to Brigade to act as Acting Brigadier during the absence of Brigadier-General Hill.

October 31st 1916.

The 52nd Canadian Battalion relieved by the 60th Canadian Bn., in the front line, right sub-sector. Relief started at 3.30 p.m. and finished at 6.15 p.m. "C", "B" and "A" Coy. in the firing line, "B" Company 52nd Bn. and "F" Company 60th Can. Bn. in close support on the right and left respectively, "A" Company 52nd Bn. in Reserve, Battalion Headquarters at SAPPER SHELTERS. Front line trenches beginning to fall in badly owing to rain, there being no revetting.
